4. MHSA Three Year Planning – powerpoint attached for MHSA Training – on websites and CCW later as it is under repair. Brief overview provided. Bills provide more focus for how MHSA dollars are spent. OAC indicates additional PEI direction (per SB1004) won't be received prior to our plan review and update. Consider thoughtful review and documentation to support strategic priorities.

Including enhanced collaboration with other counties.

 - Preliminary Community Feedback Survey Data – 201 responses so far; out to the public last night. Higher than anticipated. Some highlights – more first time responses; countywide first to send out and highest response to-date. Will increase as now it is released publicly.
 - Inadequately served population: homeless; TAY; seniors; mental health crisis; LGBTQ – preliminary. 3 most – TAY; 6-15, 0-5, aged adults.
 - Dynamic process. Quite a few open ended questions to be compiled and summarized. Filtered out N/A answers. See attached preliminary report.
 - Placer County services, barriers to services, services needed - ranked needed. MH outreach needed by groups? Homelessness is highest.
 - Demographics – voluntary responses – what variety of groups responded?

Thoughts and Input from Community:

Varied CPP times
Reach out to homeless with computer at their location
Survey restrictions per agency
Translation of survey in multiple languages
Did youth respond too? Yes – Shorten survey for youth? No – instead encourage them to answer what they can as survey structure mandatory
Target with Sierra College/PCOE computer labs
Capture/track all populations who responded.

-FSP Priority Populations Discussion – see pic and notes to add from discussion: 3 yr report/data avail Monday
Be wise with MHSAs \$ - evaluate data
Evaluate all programs to determine if still viable to address mental health concerns
FSPs making an impact – data supports – will be a priority where to provide a more focused approach (ID & target)
Review mental health outcomes alignment with services provided
MHSAs \$ will require agencies to become a provider in health care plans
Look at broad statistics too
Other comments/notes: interns paid as well as licensed counselors; after care-long term; high deductibles in health care plans

Being thoughtful and ID means to leverage MHSAs \$
Tracking – MHSAs \$ prohibits primary diagnosis treatment is substance abuse
Even though clients have substance abuse, to assess and identify the underlying primary mental health diagnosis;

Deliverables: Priorities gap is coming back to us, survey and focus groups to help identify local needs along with consideration of evaluation of programs. This group continues planning process to identify priorities for RFP to what to keep, what to add, what to eliminate or change over the next number of months in a linear process.
