

Clinical Supervision – Remote Training for New Supervisors

Training Overview

Placer County Systems of Care in collaboration with the Campaign for Community Wellness is pleased to offer this remote Clinical Supervision Training for professionals licensed with the California Board of Behavioral Sciences. This two-part 15-hour training will prepare supervisors for the full scope of current supervisor responsibilities. Topics include the nature of the supervision relationship, legal and ethical responsibilities, monitoring for crisis and safety, measuring and evaluating supervisees, developing a supervision model, developing your supervision style, improving supervisee outcomes, addressing areas of difference, troubleshooting, and more. Completion of this course is a requirement for Clinical Supervisors to be able to provide individual and group supervision to associates and trainees collecting hours for licensure as an LPCC, LMFT, and/or LCSW.

Learning Objectives

Six (6) hour Webinar:

- Participants will be able to identify three key components of supervision that produce more effective supervisees;
- Participants will be able to implement a strategy to fulfill at least five key legal and ethical responsibilities for supervisors; and
- Participants will be able to develop remediation plans for struggling supervisees.

Nine (9) hour segment (three 3-hour modules):

- Participants will be able to articulate their preferred supervision model and supervision style;
- Participants will be able to develop a supervision plan to guide the supervision relationship; and
- Participants will be able to address areas of demographic and cultural difference in supervision.

Continue Education

This fifteen (15) hour course (6-hour webinar and 9-hour remote component) meets the qualifications for fifteen (15) hours for new supervisors; continuing education credit for MFTs, LPCCs, LEPs, and/or LCSWs as required by the California Board of Behavioral Sciences. Placer County Systems of Care, CAMFT-approved Continuing Education Provider #041035, maintains responsibility for this course and its content.

Benjamin Caldwell, PsyD is a California licensed marriage and family therapist and clinical supervisor. He serves as adjunct faculty for California State University Northridge and The Wright Institute in Berkeley.

Requirement/Target Audience

This course is for clinical professionals licensed with the BBS who are or intend to be clinical supervisors. Licensure must be held for a minimum of 2 years in addition to requirements outlined in §1821, §1833.1 and §1870 of the BBS Statutes and Regulations. In order to provide supervision to all BBS disciplines, the prospective supervisor must complete an initial 15-hour training and 6-hour training every renewal period thereafter. *Placer County Employees must get supervisor approval.*
