

# SOGIE 101: Training & Panel Discussion

## ~ Sexual Orientation, Gender Identity and Expression ~

### Training Overview

This introductory training leads participants through an understanding of the differences between Sex assigned at birth, Gender Identity, Gender Expression, and Sexual/Romantic Orientation. This subject is often difficult for people to discuss, so every effort is made to make the topic as comfortable as possible for all participants. The bulk of this training session will consist of a panel discussion involving individuals sharing their experiences and answering questions from the moderator. The panel will consist of educators, family members, youth/students, and a member of the faith community. This training will give participants a better understanding of the LGBTQ+ community and introduce them to the negative myths and stereotypes that cause such damaging experiences and mental health disparities. The discussion will be geared to all levels of knowledge and comfort with this subject matter, and there will be ample time to address anonymous questions from attendees.

### Training Goals

Participants will be able to:

- Identify three gender identities, such as transgender, genderqueer, non-binary, and other gender non-conforming identities;
- Identify two myths and misconceptions regarding sexual orientation and gender identities; and
- Identify and consider two aspects of their own sexual orientation, gender identity, and gender expression.

### Continuing Education Credit:

This course meets the qualifications for one and a quarter (1.25) hours of continuing education credit for MFTs, LPCCs, LEPs and/or LCSWs as required by the California Board of Behavioral Sciences.
