### October & November Recognitions/Speaker

- National Native Heritage month is October, but since there is no meeting in November, we wanted to recognize Sierra Native Alliance and everything they do at this meeting.
  - Mateo Ortega from the Sierra Native Alliance provided the land acknowledgment for the meeting, acknowledging the Miwok, Nisenan, and Maidu tribes in the area.
  - Mateo is Mexican-American, and a Denia, Navajo and Apache Native American.
  - Sierra Native Alliance provides community resources and youth services to the native population in Placer County.
  - Programs and services they offer are:
    - The Our Families of Tradition and positive Indian parenting classes.
    - White Bison Program: AOD (alcohol and other drug) classes similar to the 12 step program.
    - The youth department currently has three groups; a youth junior group for ages 5-10 years; a young women's group which is specific to young women seeking advice and addresses the needs of teen-age, adolescent women ages 11-17 years; a general youth group for all youth ages 11-18. In the coming weeks they will be introducing a young men's group similar to the young women's group.
- The Annual Pow-Wow was held in Auburn on October 17th, turn-out was excellent and exceeded previous years' attendance.
- Mateo talked about the Orange Shirt Project that was initiated by Jessica Ornales, Youth and Adult Program Assistant at Sierra Native Alliance.
  - Project is bringing awareness to the Every Child Matters movement which represents 216 indigenous youth whose remains were discovered in Canada next to the residential schools they were going to, since that initial discovery over 2600 hundred remains have been discovered as a result of that school. The orange shirts created by youth groups were part of the art motif featured at this year's Pow-Wow.

### Announcements and Observances-

- National institutes of Health-Office of Equity, Diversity, and Inclusion has a lot of resources that align with the work we do, bringing awareness to public health and behavioral health.
- Hispanic Heritage Month was September 15 to October 15th
  - National theme was Esperanza which is about hope and bringing hope.

### Community Announcements

- Deborah Duell-Stephens with Family Resource Center-
  - The center currently hosts a Women's Empowerment Road to Wellness group which addresses anxiety and depression, as well as an Anger Management group.
  - If your organization would like to have the Family Resource Center host one of your groups, contact Deborah. We can host at our organization in Roseville, or we come to you.
  - The Center is currently seeking a licensed clinician to work at their Roseville location. Hoping to hire a bilingual clinician, if you know of anyone looking for a clinician position call her.
- Indira infante with Cal Voices-
  - They are currently looking for two bilingual Family Advocates. One to work in our Tahoe office, and another for our Family Mobile Crisis Team in Tahoe.
  - Two new Family Advocates joined their team this week; Ellen Mason-Foster and Jina Coronado.
  - Cal Voices supports parents who have open child welfare cases in Placer County. Indira would like to acknowledge Michelle Irwin for her collaboration with Latino leadership, Probation and Wrap Around teams last week.
- Jasmine with Sierra Community House announced that there is a Health Event at Kings Beach next Saturday.

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### County Updates:

- Mobile Crisis Grants (Amy Ellis, Director of Adult System of Care (ASOC))
  - Working as a system to improve our perinatal services, substance use and psychiatric care for population that meet that criteria. More to come as it develops.
  - Just received another grant to expand the Mobile Crisis Teams and add additional positions to span all ages across SOC in the coming months.
  - Whole Person Care Grant for the coordination of homeless population with specialty mental health care, ending and will transition to become Enhanced Care Management.

### Whole Person Care/ECM Transition (Geoff Smith)

- The transition from Whole Person Care (WPC) to Enhanced Care Management (ECM)
  - Will be able to link individuals to intensive mental health, SUS services, and assist with housing.
  - New CAL-Aim model, clients will have a designated case manager that will oversee all services instead of separate case managers for each programs
  - ECM's caseload will increase from 20-40 people per caseload, since more individuals will qualify, more people will be served.
  - Community supports has additional services available for people with Medi-Cal.
  - Enhanced coverage for high need populations, homeless will remain a priority population.
  - Target date is January, ECM is no longer part of Public Health and now part of ASOC.
  - Managed Care plans are responsible for ECM and there will be other providers besides Placer County.
  - Referral process and contracts are still being worked out, all existing WPC clients will be grandfathered in and first to be assigned.
  - More information to come when available.

### Aaron Cadore (Housing Project Coordinator)

- Aaron comes from Sacramento County with a background in Adult and Child Protective Services, Welfare Services, and Housing and Homelessness.
- Will stepping into Kathy Denton's old role.

### Housing /Homelessness: Evictions, , Home key 2.0, Mercy Housing, , Emergency Housing Vouchers, PIT Count

- Board & Care- (Jennifer Price -AMHI)
  - 15 bed Board and Care facility will open December 1<sup>st</sup>
  - Facility is fully licensed and in the process of hiring staff
  - CA ER Rental Assistance Program- the eviction moratorium ended on September 30<sup>th</sup>
  - Families that are still in need of rental assistance can apply at [housingiskey.com](https://housingiskey.com) through the end of December, possibly longer if funding is available.
  - Families can remain in their homes and get moratorium on their eviction just by applying at [housingiskey.com](https://housingiskey.com).
  - Housing is Key recently received 70 emergency housing vouchers and was able to provide 70 homeless families with housing.

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### Strategic Plan (Amy Ellis)

- HHS along with cities have been part of the strategic planning process kicked off a few months ago that didn't include providers
- This is an opportunity for counties and cities to come together to discuss and strategize anything from development, to housing and enforcement related to housing and homelessness.
- Committees have been meeting regularly to complete the housing report due in December.
- Home key 2.0 is new state funding for developing projects, Placer County is bidding for projects
- Mercy housing- Will be moving residents next month
- PIT count- need to start planning for this coming in January

### 22/23 Annual Update/PEI Report/Peer Certification (Sue Compton)

- We are working towards annual update for 22-23, for services and forecasted budget changes to programs is due June 30, 2022
- PCN meeting will be December 3rd, still working on a topic, may be on workforce retention strategies, will be talking more about the annual update and will have 21-22 data. 3 YR PEI Evaluation Report
- PEI report is also due, recap of 3 years of data included may incorporate in one document-includes outcomes for intervention programs.
- Peer Certification process is currently on-going, Cal MHSA is putting together what the Peer Certification opportunities will look like.
- Cal MHSA is currently hosting listening sessions to get input on how people are applying for trainings. Those interested in a listening meeting to provide input about that process go to [CALmhsa.org/peer-certification](http://CALmhsa.org/peer-certification). Sessions are tomorrow and next week.

### California Reducing Disparities Project (CRDP)

- This is a statewide project funded by MHSa that focused on 5 demographic populations and developing 35 different projects across the state for those populations.
- Projects have all gone through the pilot stage, they've been written up and now there is additional funding that's going out to those communities.
- Placer County did not have a project in our community, but Sue has made multiple requests for a speaker from the project come and share how those projects were written up how to receive funding for reducing disparities in Placer County.
