  - Partner volunteers with children in foster care
    - Court Appointed Special Advocates (CASA)
    - Friend and mentor to child; also inform the court
  - Added “Level Up” program to give staff additional training to work with youth involved with the juvenile justice system.
  - Added “Be Bold” program to specialize services for children involved with Commercial Sexual Exploitation of Children (CSEC)
  - Family Mentor Program – support struggling parents
  - Prosper Placer – partner with ally families to support stability (2 year program, 85% graduation rate)
  - K9s 4 Kids
- Granite Wellness Centers – Nancy Taylor
  - Services throughout Placer County
  - Outpatient Services
  - Adolescent Outpatient Treatment; Parent Project
  - Student Assistance Program – collaboration to intervene on possession offenses
  - Student and Family Support (SFSP)

### County Housing/Homelessness Updates: Project HomeKey

- Amy Ellis – Deputy Director, Placer County Adult System of Care
  - \$23.5M for HomeKey 2.0
  - Largest project award for medium sized county
- Jennifer Price - AMIH
  - 82 studio units for people with highest need off by name list
  - Target TAY and VET populations; individuals and couples
  - 24/7 Housing support on site
  - Target renovations to open by this time next year
  - Some current residents grandfathered in, leaving approximately 40 new housing units
