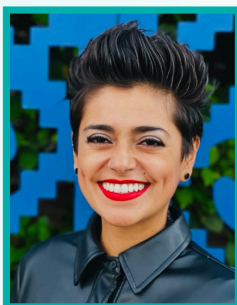


Reclaiming 2SQT+ (Two-spirit, Queer and Trans) Youth Thriving: An Intersectional, Anti-racist and Radical Love Approach to Suicide Prevention

Description:

Prior to European colonization, 2-SQT communities were celebrated and venerated in Indigenous and many communities worldwide. Despite this critical historical context, 2-SQT communities in the US and worldwide continue to be targeted politically and discriminated against daily. Mental health providers have a unique responsibility in mitigating suicidal risk among 2-SQT youth, however, are often operating in a system of gatekeeping that can further hinder the health and wellbeing of 2-SQT youth. This training will review clinical applications for providing affirming support and language, discuss why intersectionality and anti-racism matters as we employ 2-SQT affirming models of care, and learn how these culturally responsive clinical applications are critical to preventing suicide and cultivating communities where 2SQT youth can thrive.

Dr. Laura Minero (She/Her/Ella) is a licensed psychologist and specializes in working with BIPOC, 2SQT+, Spanish-speaking and immigrant youth and adults via her independent practice Yolotl Libre Therapy, Training, and Consulting. She earned her PhD in Counseling Psychology from University of Wisconsin-Madison and has dedicated her life-affirming work to revolutionizing systems that adversely impact undocumented, queer, trans, and communities of color. She contributed to scientific studies used to inform national policy as a Science Policy and Technology Fellow with the National Academies of Sciences, Engineering, and Medicine. In recognition of her contributions to enacting change, social justice, and being a champion for anti-racism, equity and liberation, Dr. Minero has received several state and national service awards from the National Latinx Psychological Association, and the American Psychological Association's Division for Counseling Psychology and the Society for the Psychological Study of Culture, Ethnicity, and Race.
