

Secondary Trauma Trainings with Jules Alvarado



Training Overview

The Alvarado Consulting and Treatment Group provides Trauma Informed Care trainings to address workforce burnout among staff who provide vital care to our behavioral health clients. This training opportunity provides two distinct trainings: 1) an *Initial Introductory Cohort* for an overview of Secondary Trauma and 2) a *Level-up Cohort* for those who want to increase their understanding with interactive real-life examples. The *Initial Introductory Cohort* provides an overview of Secondary Trauma, Vicarious Trauma, and Generational Burnout. It will include signs, risks and ways to mitigate the negative impact of Secondary Trauma. The *Level-up Cohort* provides participants an opportunity to actively participate in seeking support in treatment planning. This cohort will provide a deeper understanding of trauma informed approaches and offers strategies to prevent burnout from secondary trauma.

Introductory Cohort Learning Objectives

Participants will be able to:

- Differentiate between three categories of Secondary Trauma;
- Identify three signs and/or symptoms that indicate they may be suffering from Secondary Trauma; and
- Develop two to three practical strategies to mitigate the negative impacts of Secondary Trauma.

Level-up Cohort Learning Objectives

Participants will be able to:

- Differentiate between three trauma informed care responses;
- Identify three basic principles to identify, mitigate, and prevent Secondary Trauma;
- Develop and practice at least three strategies to prevent burnout from Secondary Trauma; and
- Develop an action plan with two approaches to apply to their work through the lens of trauma informed care.

Target Audience:

These *Secondary Trauma Trainings* are intended for anyone interested in understanding the short and long-term effects of emotional and psychological trauma and how to effectively respond and recover from trauma. It is a recommended training for Social Workers, Educators, Counselors and Psychotherapists, First Responders, Foster and Adoptive Parents, Leadership staff, Call Centers, and Leaders of workplace environments where stress impacts performance, moral and employee well-being.

Schedule:

There are three (3) separate Cohorts for this training. The 1st and 2nd cohorts are identical trainings and attendance at either is required in order to attend the 3rd cohort. The 3rd cohort is an interactive session working with real-life and case examples. Each cohort is 2 hours with a 15 minute break given at the trainer's discretion. Registered users will receive an email with a Zoom link to access the remote training prior to the training start date. Participants are encouraged to login early and will be let into the training as soon as 10 minutes prior to start of the training time listed on the flyer. This remote training requires participants to have access to a computer with webcam capabilities, audio and reliable internet.
