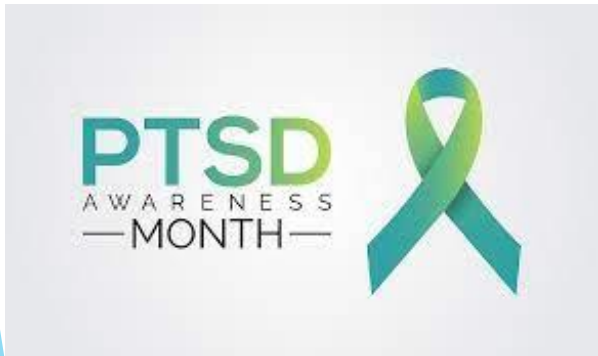

Governor's Transformation of MHSA



In March, the Governor released his proposal to Modernize California's Behavioral Health System. After multiple webinars, listening sessions, etc, the updated proposal is now reflected in:

- **AB 531** (Irwin) –Behavioral Health Infrastructure Bond Act of 2023 (\$4.7 billion)
- **SB 326** (Eggman) –MHSA Modernization

WHAT COMES NEXT: The two bills will work their way through the California Legislature in the coming months. The behavioral health legislative package will go to the voters for approval in March 2024, after consideration and approval by Legislature and Governor Newsom's signature in 2023.

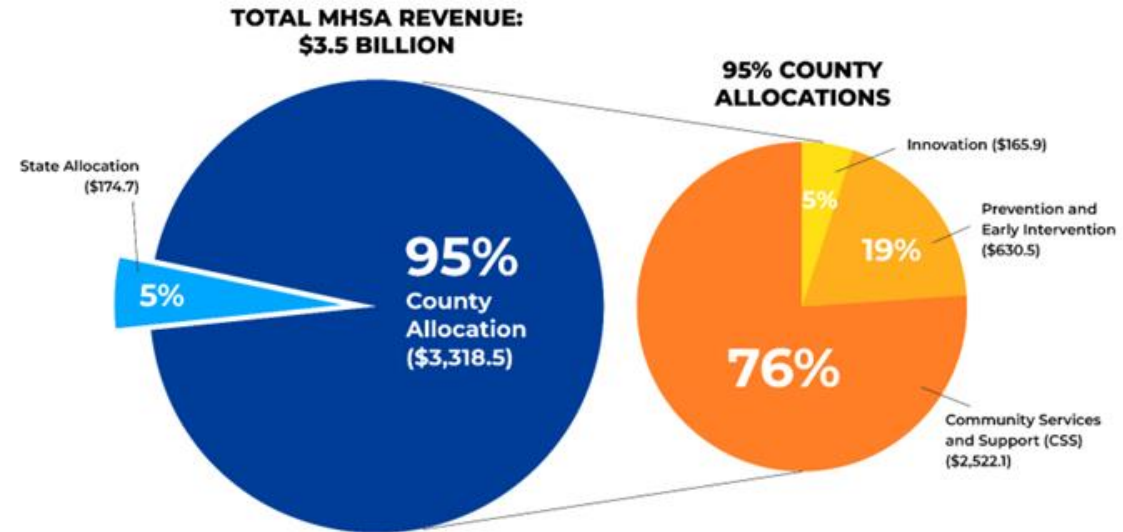

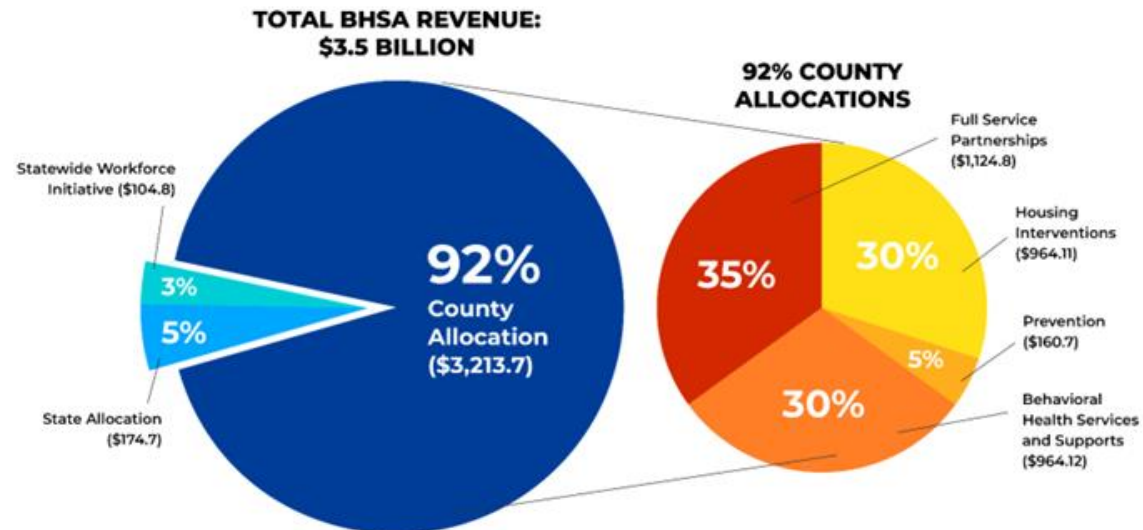
Governor's Transformation of MHSA

- Expanded Full-Service Partnership (FSP) capacity for all ages
- Increased Housing Supports, including outreach to unhoused
- Growth of certified peer workforce across providers
- 24/7 mobile crisis expansion; 988 integration
- Expanded prevention and early intervention programming for youth, TAY, and families, including in Tahoe Truckee
- Enhanced ability to address needs of underserved and unserved communities, including collaborative culturally responsive care.

Opportunities



Continue to:

- address additional supports needed for older adults and LGBTQ+; outreach to AAPI communities to better understand needs
- leverage increased statewide grant opportunities for crisis services, infrastructure for 24/7 bed capacity solutions, bridge housing supports, and school-based youth supports.
- identify opportunities to address behavioral workforce shortages, including CalMHSA county supports
- maximize statewide system transformation: CalAIM implementation, electronic health record system, peer certification, upcoming legislation
